

GOLDEN RETRIEVER LIFETIME STUDY

At All West, we have 4 participating golden retrievers in the Golden Retriever Lifetime Study through the Morris Animal Foundation. This study is aiming to identify the factors associated with development of cancer and other major diseases in dogs and help our understanding to better our prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of those diseases. This year the study has reached it's 3,000 participant. They will follow these dogs throughout their life. Every year we do a full comprehensive exam, fecal, bloodwork, urinalysis, hair, and nail analysis.


DR. GARY'S ADVENTURE

DIGITAL DENTAL X-RAYS

In the beginning of 2016, All West added a digital x-ray machine for dentals. The use of the x-ray machine allows the doctors to see below the gum line. This is beneficial for finding abscessed roots which can be hidden on normal looking teeth. Dental x-rays ensure that what appears to be healthy in the mouth is indeed healthy. The digital aspect of the new dental x-rays allows the images to appear instantaneously instead of being developed which shortens the time the animals are under anesthesia.

C.E. IN FLORIDA

Dr. Gary traveled down to Florida for his continuing education in early December. The C.E. was put on by the AAEP organization, American Association of Equine Practitioners. He attended the annual convention which aimed to expand knowledge, emerging diagnostics, and new treatments across the medical spectrum to help practitioners provide optimal care to their equine patients. The conference offered more than 130 hours of continuing education throughout the week in imaging, infectious disease management, internal medicine, lameness and reproduction.
